Author's Guide

Japanese Journal of Thrombosis and Haemostasis (JJTH) is the official journal of the Japanese Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis (JSTH) and is published online and in print, six times per year, to provide a forum for the members of JSTH to exchange information and ideas within the research community and to diffuse the society's activity.

1. Contributors

Members of JSTH can submit their original article to JJTH. The first author of the article must be a current member of JSTH, whereas other contributors need not be.

2. Copyright

JSTH reserves the copyright of all materials included in the published article. Authors of all accepted manuscripts are required to assign copyright of their papers to the Japanese Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis. Copyright assignment is a condition of publication and papers will not be proceeded to printing unless a Copyright Assignment Form has been completed before publication.

3. Acceptance and publication of the submitted manuscript

JJTH publishes articles on all aspects of thrombosis and haemostasis. Articles may cover both basic and clinical research. These may be reported in either Japanese or English as a Regular article, Case study, Review article, Topics, or Letter to the editor. A manuscript (or its essential substance) that has been published other than as an abstract in any language or format, or that is currently submitted elsewhere for print or electronic publication, will not be considered for publication.

Acceptance of a manuscript will be decided by the Editorial Board after the peer-review process. Following initial peer review, articles judged worthy of further consideration often require revisions, including additional experimentation. If revised manuscripts are not received within 3 months of the date of the initial decision, the manuscript will be considered retracted.

4. Adherence to ethical principles

All the authors are requested to adhere to scientists' ethical principles described in "Statement: Code of Conduct for Scientists" issued by the Science Council of Japan (SCJ). All studies that involve human subjects must abide by the rules of the appropriate Institutional Ethical Committee of the institution in which the research was conducted and by the tenants of the World Medical Association's (most recently revised) Declaration of Helsinki.

5. Scientific misconduct

If scientific misconduct, such as fabrication, falsification, plagiarism, and duplicate submission, is confirmed, all the authors will be penalized according to "Instruction Manual for Scientific Misconduct". If scientific misconduct is confirmed in a previously published article, the article will be retracted.

6. Disclosure of Conflict of Interest (COI)

All the authors are requested to disclose COI using the form II of "Self-reported potential Conflict of Interest of Authors" after consulting with "JSTH's conflict of interest policy".

7. Manuscript submission

All manuscripts must be submitted online through the Editorial Manager System (<u>URL http://www.editorialmanager.com/jjsth/</u>).

8. Manuscript Format

Manuscripts should be formatted as described below.

1) Length of manuscript (including text, figures, tables and references).

Regular article: up to 7 printed pages.

Case study: up to 5 printed pages.

Review article: up to 7 printed pages.

Topics: up to 2 printed pages.

Letter to the editor: up to 2 printed pages.

- 2) On the cover page, the title of the manuscript, the name(s) of the author(s), the name and the address of the affiliation where the research was carried out, and the contact information (phone and fax number, and e-mail address) of the corresponding author should be described.
- 3) Regular article and Case study should include abstract (not to exceed 200 words), key words (up to 5), Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgement, References, and Figure legends, in the text in separated pages.
- 4) JJTH accepts digital JPEG, TIFF and EPS images as well as Microsoft PowerPoint (.ppt) files. The suggested minimum resolution is 300dpi. Figures of histology or cells should be bigger than 1 MB, and scale bars are required for electron microscope images.
- 5) References should appear as a numbered list at the end of the manuscript and with numbers with superscript in the text.
 - i) Journal: author (all authors): title. journal volume: pages, year. Ex.) Kokame K, Sakata Y, Kokubo Y, Miyata T: von Willebrand factor-to-ADAMTS13 ratio increases with age in a Japanese population. J Thromb Haemost 9: 1426-1488, 2011.
 - ii) Book: author: book title, city, publisher, year.
 - iii) Book Section: author, title, editors (eds), book title. city, publisher, year, pages.

Ex.) Hawiger J: Adhesive interactions of blood cells and the vascular wall, in Colman RW, Hirsh J, Marder VJ, Salzman EW(eds): Hemostasis and Thrombosis, Basic principles and clinical practice, 3rd ed. Philadelphia, Lippincott, 1994, 762-796.

9. Publication and reprint fees

Manuscript submission fee is free for all types of manuscript, unless authors require rapid publication. Rapid publication costs 10,000 yen for processing. Color figures as well as figures requiring image processing requires an additional cost for processing. Reprints must be ordered in quantities of 50 reprints at the time that page proofs are reviewed.
